These events are open to all members of Weald Motor Club (including members of CDMC, MMKMC, and SDMC) and will be governed by the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations, and any written instructions the promoting clubs may issue for the Event. Club membership cards will be inspected at Signing On. An MSA Waiver of Permit will be issued for each

Each Event will start at a venue to be advertised in the organising clubs' magazines/websites and will finish either at the same venue or at a nearby venue which will be advised in the written instructions issued on the night. Each event will start at 8.00pm, with signing on from 7.30pm. All crews must be signed on by 7.55pm, The finish time will be stated in the written Final Instructions issued on the night, which will also advise whether there is a single absolute finish time or a penaltyfree finish time followed by a penalty period to a final absolute finish. Timing will be by the Clerk of the Course's own watch/clock which will be deemed to be correct, and their decision upon lateness will be final.

The minimum entry for each Event is 5 and should this minimum figure not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the Event. The maximum is 30. Entry is on a 'first come, first served' basis. The entry fee is £10.00 and should an entry be cancelled, refunds will be at the organisers' discretion. Entry opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on the evening of each event. Entries will be accepted on the night and entry forms will be available at the start venue for each event. The Secretary of the Meetings to whom all enquires about each event should be sent are as listed below. Each event will be run as very low-key treasure hunt type of Navigational Event. Crews will be given various points, defined by various types of navigation, at which the answers to questions will be found. The car is an incidental means of transport between the various points. To achieve a maximum score, crews are only required to visit 75% of the points listed (and scores will only be counted for the first 75% of the points visited) and ample time will be allowed for crews to visit these points. The points are defined so that there is no single obvious route between them, and it is up to each individual crew to decide which points to visit and in what order. The majority of the points are such that crews will be required to leave the car to find the answers. The relevant Ordnance Survey 1:50 000 Landranger Map(s) needed will also be notified in the organising clubs' magazines/websites. In addition to the current version of these maps, crews will require the usual navigational aids (such as a Map Romer, pencils, eraser, &c) and a good torch will prove essential. The estimated likely maximum mileage is 60.

Scoring will be as follows -

Each question correctly answered:

Dangerous, reckless driving, undue noise or any acts likely to cause nuisance to the public:

10 points Exclusion

Not reporting to the finish by the time specified in the event Final Instructions:

Exclusion

Partial marks may be awarded for partially correct answers, at the event organisers discretion. Similarly, very obvious guesses may be penalised. Results will be announced at the finish venue on the night. Awards will be presented to the first two crews, subject to a minimum entry of 8, or to the winning crew if there are fewer than 8 entries. A simple tie-breaker may be used to separate identical scores.

Cars must be fully road legal, (taxed, insured, MOT'd where required by law, and comply with 'Construction & Use' laws), and any auxiliary lighting must be covered or disconnected. No car carrying any external advertising/sponsorship livery (apart from their club's name), or which in the organisers' opinion is in any way likely to cause a nuisance during the Event, will be allowed to start.

Unless otherwise advised, advance entrants should assume their entry has been accepted. No final instructions will be issued prior to the evening of the event, so entrants should arrive at the start at the specified time. As cars will start at the same time, there will be no seeding.
